## **History and Tradition**

With a proud history of delivering education to young people in Dungannon and the surrounding district for over half a century Drumglass High School began life as Dungannon Intermediate School built in 1957. Originally consisting of the boys' school and girls' school these were amalgamated in 1977 to form Dungannon Secondary School. In 1992 the school was renamed Drumglass High School after the parish in which it is situated.

In 1997 the school was chosen as one of the "Pathfinder" schools to be built by Private Finance Initiative (PFI) and in September 2000 Drumglass High School was opened as the first school in Northern Ireland to be completed by the PFI. The present school campus was designed with the most modern facilities. These are maintained and managed by Martins Facilities Management and Mount Charles to a high standard.

A child-centred school, pastoral care is given a high priority and every effort is made to create a secure, supportive and caring environment in which all pupils are valued and encouraged to achieve their full potential.



#### **Our Mission Statement and Aims**

We at Drumglass High School, Dungannon try to promote and reward success. We strive:

- to provide all pupils with a professional, supportive and caring environment
- to develop each pupil's personal and academic potential

## **Transition from Primary School**

At Drumglass High School we recognise that transition to post primary school can be an exciting and challenging time. We are aware that our pupils come from many different primary schools, some large and some small. Our aim is simple – we work hard to ensure that the move between schools is as stress free, well supported and smooth as possible.

We have strong links with all of our feeder primary schools and children from primary five onwards may already have visited Drumglass for our popular link days:

- School Pantomime
- Primary 6 Taste and See Day
- Maths Fun Road Show
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) Events

Drumglass staff visit all of our local primary schools to talk to the primary seven pupils about our school and answer any questions that they may have. Staff also meet with primary school teachers to ensure that we are well informed and fully prepared for the arrival of the new pupils.

All of our new year eight pupils visit the school with their parents in June. Parents attend an information session and pupils get to see the facilities before meeting up again to sample lunch in "Zest", our quality canteen. All new year 8 pupils attend an induction day at the end of August. These events are organised by the year eight pastoral team who ensure that pupils are familiar with their new school.

In addition, all year 8 classes are linked to prefect mentors who accompany them between classes and assist the new pupils with their new routines.





Drumglass High School operates under the overall leadership of the Principal who works in close consultation with the Vice-Principal. The school is fortunate to have a team of outstanding teachers supported effectively by dedicated classroom assistants, administrative staff and ancillary personnel.

All staff members are fully committed to the welfare and development of our students academically, vocationally and pastorally.

# Pastoral Care

Drumglass has a long tradition of placing pastoral care and the individual needs of the pupils at the very centre of what it does. As a school we are more focused on a student's exit skills and qualities than on their skills and qualities on arrival. We place the individual child at the centre of all that we do, providing as wide a range of learning experiences as possible. Our aim is to best equip our pupils for the world they will enter as citizens and as contributors to society.

Every new pupil will be allocated a form teacher, whom we will try to ensure is with them throughout their time at the school. Form teachers work in conjunction with our very experienced pastoral team to evaluate and assess the needs of each pupil and provide the necessary support.

Our central focus within learning is to provide the conditions and environment which allows each child to reach their full potential. With the support of home, organisations within the wider community and the pastoral care team we aim to provide a safe, friendly, warm and caring school environment which supports young people in their learning and ensures that their welfare is of paramount importance.



## Catering for pupils with English as a Second Language (EAL)



The EAL department aims to support and guide EAL/ newcomer pupils in order to ensure full inclusion and participation in school life. Opportunities are created to develop the pupils' English language skills, promote the sharing of pupils' home culture and reward their learning.

Two members of staff work in the EAL department; the EAL Co-ordinator Mrs McKillion, a member of the teaching staff and a native Polish speaker assisted by the EAL classroom assistant, Mrs Kelpsaite, a native Lithuanian speaker. In addition to the focused support that newcomer children receive from the EAL department, all departments liaise with the SELB's Inclusion and Diversity Service for advice and curriculum support.

The EAL department supports pupils in many ways including:

- offering ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)
  classes
- supporting curricular work in the classroom through classroom assistance and working with subject teachers
- providing opportunities for newcomer pupils to express their own culture by active participation in school events
- offering classes and exams to pupils in their native language where possible
- providing early morning and afternoon homework clubs
- running an EAL club where pupils can seek guidance and support in an informal environment
- meeting with parents to discuss academic and pastoral issues

Inclusion of all nationalities and cultures is central. All pupils are encouraged to share their background and experiences through various school events. We value the international dimension of our pupil body and it is our experience that all pupils benefit from working together in a friendly, supportive environment.

### **Facilities**

In 2000 the school moved into the new building. This was designed with the most modern facilities and is maintained to the high specifications under contract by H&J Martins Facilities Management and Mount Charles. The school has a wide range of both general and specialist classrooms. Our general classrooms are bright, appealing and well equipped. Each one has an interactive white board.

Our specialist rooms include Science Laboratories, a Library with an Apple Mac Suite, Art and Design Studios, a Music Room including a Recording Studio, Computer Suites, Home Economics rooms, a Fitness Suite, a Design and Technology Centre, a Careers Suite, a Drama/Lecture Theatre, a Business Education Room, and Language rooms.

In addition the school has a large Assembly Hall/Gymnasium used for PE classes, assemblies and public events, while the Sports Hall provides an indoor facility to compliment the outdoor pitches and sports facilities.

Zest, our restaurant, catering for pupils, staff and guests is run by Mount Charles to the highest standards.

School offices are centrally located for ease of pupil access.

Our modern, well maintained facilities provide our staff and pupils with a first class environment for learning and teaching.

# Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG)

In Drumglass CEIAG is at the heart of the curriculum. The central aim of the school's CEIAG programme is to help young people to acquire the skills, attitudes and abilities they will need to chart their path through life with confidence and to be effective in a variety of adult roles and spheres of life. In support of this over-riding aim, the CEIAG programme in Drumglass High School helps pupils to develop:

- Knowledge and understanding of themselves and others as individuals – their strengths and limitations, personal qualities, interests, abilities, skills, potential values, motivation and needs and to be able to consider how their attributes and ambitions relate to future lifestyles, education, training and employment opportunities.
- Knowledge and understanding of the world in which they live, the major roles which people play concurrently or sequentially in various spheres of life, employment and other careers opportunities available and routes of entry accessible to them.
- Skills and personal qualities to manage their career development, including the ability to make considered choices, formulate and implement personal career plans and cope with transition from school to adult life.

Guidance Interviews are carried out with all Year 11 and 12 pupils by personnel from the local Training and Employment Agency. In Year 12 all pupils have the opportunity to do one week's work experience. The school enjoys close links with the community and opportunities are made for the pupils to attend careers conventions, industrial visits, talks from visiting speakers and mock interviews. Each Year 12 pupil is trained in interview techniques and undertakes a mock interview with invited mentors from the business world. During careers education classes, pupils develop their Personal Career Plan.
